**We are against the wind farm
project in Mt. Carondio for the
following reasons:**

- The archaeological and environ-
mental value of Mt. Carondio is
enormous: 34 megalithic monu-
ments, traces of Roman gold
mines, a Roman encampment at
Moyapán, endangered flora and
traditional highland pastures
known as brañas. This legacy
prompted local authorities to
grant it the status of 'Protected
Landscape' in the 1990s. How-
ever, it was never been legalized
and the municipality continues to
use it for tourist promotion.
